On the 18th & 19th of May, I had the privilege of attending the U3A Network Queensland State Conference at Tweed Heads hosted by U3A Twin Towns and, as I also hold the position of Vice President of Network Queensland, it was not only a very busy time for me, but also an extremely rewarding one. It was great to see that out of the 32 U3As in Queensland, 28 attended the conference, some travelling from as far afield as Cairns and the Atherton Tablelands and just about every major city in between. KEYNOTE SPEAKER — DR STEVEN SALISBURY



Dr Steve Salisbury and his team have discovered Australia's Jurassic Park.

Along a 25 kilometre stretch of the Dampier Peninsula, in the remote but beautiful Kimberleys, they braved sharks, crocodiles, massive tides and major development to uncover thousands of dinosaur tracks belonging to 21 different types of dinosaurs. This is the most diverse in the world. Steve describes it as the "Cretaceous equivalent of the Serengeti." The tracks are in rocks that are 130 -140 million years old – much older than those found in outback

Queensland. Among them is the only confirmed evidence for stegosaurus in Australia. Some of these footprints are 1.7 metres long.

What makes Steve's work even more interesting is the political battle he had to wage because the WA government had selected the site for a \$40 billion liquid natural gas project. With the traditional custodians of the land assisting him, the area was declared a National Heritage Site in 2011.

Come along to hear Steve, a brilliant speaker, detail his adventures in this remarkable part of the world in his Keynote address for this year's Winter School. *Dinosaurs, Dreamtime and Drones* is a fascinating look at the ancient and modern combining to give us answers in the 21st century to a very old question.

City Campus Venues:

Each class is designated as either Adelaide St or Creek St in the class description. The Adelaide St venue is at 232 Adelaide St, adjacent to Anzac Square. To reach it from 97 Creek St, walk towards the corner of Creek and Adelaide, then cross to the diagonally opposite corner. About 50 metres along Adelaide St you will see the entrance doorway to 232 Adelaide St. Take the lift to the fifth floor.

Class Fees

Classes in the City Campus venues (Creek St and Adelaide St) are \$5 per session unless otherwise indicated. Class fees for computer classes in the Creek St lab are shown as a cost for the full duration of the course, which must be paid in advance in the first week. Computer classes in other rooms may be shown as a weekly fee. Classes at other venues are free of charge unless indicated. To attend any U3A classes, you must be a current financial member of U3A Brisbane (\$40 per year).

Class Enrolments

You can enrol in a class on the U3A website, or by contacting the tutor directly. In either case, enrolment is not automatically granted. You must receive confirmation from the tutor that your enrolment is accepted before attending the class. Your U3A Brisbane Membership card must be produced when you attend your first class. If you change to a higher level class, or subsequently find that you cannot attend the course, please advise the tutor so that your place may be offered to another member.

Computer Classes at Creek St.

All students enrolling for Intermediate or Advanced classes are expected to have appropriate prior knowledge. All applicants for any computer course should have access to a computer and bring a USB memory stick to classes.
