Sailing through the Pumicestone Passage we may see turtles, dugongs and migratory shorebirds, before arriving at Bongaree Jetty on Bribie Island.

On the island we have **two hours** to explore or just take a relaxing stroll along the waterfront.

MEETING POINT: Lady Brisbane, Recreation Hub, Commercial Pontoon, 449 Kingsford Smith Drive, Hamilton, Qld 4007. (opposite Hamilton Hotel)

This is *Lady Brisbane*'s own pontoon, a 2-minute walk from Bus Stop 19, and adjacent to the *CityCat* terminal at Brett's Wharf. **Departing 9.00am, returning 5pm. Be there by 8.45am.**

Parking: Free street parking in streets around the Hamilton Hotel and Riverview Terrace.

The Museum (which is free) is 500m from the jetty. Turning right at the Jetty another option could be to take a half-hour walk to Red Beach passing by the RSL, where you might like to take a cool drink with you to Buckley's Hole Bird-hide which is half-way, where you can do some bird watching. Turning left at the Jetty only 3 minutes away is the Bowls Club where you might have a coffee or soft drink while watching the locals competing. Three minutes further is the Water Tower Art with supersized artwork chosen by the residents and business operators who live and work near the tower and reflects Bribie Island's marine life and waterways. The artwork aims to bring awareness to the region's delicate ecosystem and the important balance of humans living in harmony with nature.

PLEASE ENROL NOW

Our two City Campus venues are open in Term 4 under our COVID Safe rules. All classes are now a maximum 90 minutes, except for a small number of double-length classes which are now possible. **More than 100 face-to-face classes** are available in City Campus.

60 district face-to-face classes are also available. Face-to-face classes are required to adhere to our COVID Safe plans as published on our website home page.

Additionally, we offer **40 Zoom classes** that you can attend online.

It is important that members enrol for Term 4 classes as early as possible as many classes are subject to a room capacity limit. Tutors can also roll over class members from Term 3 into Term 4.

Class Enrolment Procedure

Members can enrol in a class in one of three ways:

Use *Class Search* on the website to find your class, then click the *Enrol* button to submit your enrolment application to the tutor.

<u>OR</u>

If you wish to continue in a class in which you were enrolled in Term 3, use *Member Dashboard* on the website to **re-enrol**.

<u>OR</u>

Contact the tutor directly by email or phone. Please advise the tutor of your membership number. Some tutors do not list their contact details for privacy reasons, but you can contact them through *Class Search* on the website.

City Campus Procedures

COVID-19 is still with us. We have a COVID Safe plan and a list of precautions which have been implemented to reduce risk to our members who are in the most vulnerable age group. We have adopted standardised timeslots for classes so that it is easy for members to attend two or more successive classes.

Class fees

Class fees must be paid in advance. These should be paid online if possible, to avoid congestion and delays at the office. They can also be paid at the Creek Street office but remember to socially distance if waiting your turn at the office. If bringing cash, please have the correct amount to facilitate the process. Credit cards are preferred. Zoom classes have a fee of \$25 and should be paid online, also before term starts.

General Rules for both Creek Street and Adelaide Street

(Remember: Do not attend if you are unwell)

Check your class time carefully. (This can be done on the Member Dashboard)

Class duration may be up to 90 minutes. Some classes have a double session, but this can only be done by special arrangement organised in advance by the Tutor.

Kitchens will be open, but it is still a good idea to bring your own water. Foyers will also be open with seating.

We are using our own QR Code system to register attendances. You will find a printed QR Code in your classroom or near the entrance. Please read the instructions on the website home page about how to use this code, and practise to make sure your phone will read the QR Code. Install a QR Code Scan app if necessary.

This will be **required each time you attend a class**.

If you do not have a phone that you can use, then another class member can enter your number on their phone to register your attendance. You must know your U3A number.

Remember to avoid congestion if possible.

Carry a face mask and wear when appropriate.

Just go to our website www.u3abrisbane.org.au and click on Member Payment on the lower menu. You can choose to pay class fees at the same time if you are enrolled in a City Campus or Zoom class. You will be asked for your membership number, surname and credit card number.

No password is required for this purpose. You can use only Visa, Mastercard or PayPal for online payments. There is also an option to pay by Bank Transfer, whereby you will be provided with our account details.

Class Schedule for Term 4 - 2023

Term Dates:

Term 3 ends on Friday 15 September. Term 4 starts on Tuesday 3 October and finishes on Friday 8 December.

Irrespective of whether you are enrolling in a face-to-face class or an online or other class type, please enrol as soon as possible for Term 4 to ensure your place.

Inactive Classes

Inactive classes are **not shown** in this schedule. These are classes where the tutor intends to restart at some time in the near future. Although these classes are not listed here, they are shown on the website under *Class Search* but are highlighted with an orange bar.

Zoom Classes

These classes are being conducted online as interactive video sessions using Zoom software. Zoom classes are identified in **blue** in the schedule and in Class Search on the website. If you have not enrolled in a Zoom class before, you are encouraged to do so. It is not difficult as a participant since you only have to click on a link sent by the tutor prior to the session.

Face-to-face classes

These are identified in green in the schedule and in Class Search on the website.

Class Fees

To attend any classes, you must be a current financial member of U3A Brisbane (\$45 per year). For City Campus face-to-face classes, class fees must be paid in advance for the term (typically \$45 - \$50). For Zoom classes, the fee is \$25 per term.

Class Enrolments

You can enrol in a class using *Class Search* on the U3A website, or by contacting the tutor directly. To re-enrol in an existing class, you may use the *Member Dashboard*. If you enrol online you may assume that your enrolment is accepted unless the tutor advises otherwise.

Class Attendance

Each week, use the camera app to scan the U3A class attendance QR code. This will be on a sheet inside the venue or in your classroom. Remember to avoid congestion. After you have scanned the code, you can go to your seat to enter your member number and surname
