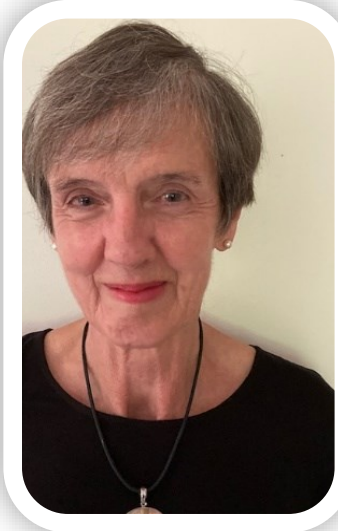




Editor's Notes from Jean Smith

Vaccination

Class News

Enrolments for 2022 open on 28th November. At this stage the current capacity limitations will remain as will the other COVID Safe rules including the wearing of masks. This may change by next year. We will follow the Government directions and revise our COVID Safe plans accordingly. But remember to enrol early to ensure a place in the classes of your choice.

On the brighter side, some of the restrictions on our classes will be eased. We will allow double classes e.g. Movie and Art classes. Games involving washable pieces e.g. Chess, Mahjong, Scrabble will also be back if their Tutors are available. Other classes e.g. cards, choir, recorder will have to wait a little longer. We are being careful until we see how Queensland copes with open borders and the resulting increased risk.

2022 Fees

Class fees will remain at the normal rate of \$5 per week and \$8 for a double class. We will still retain the voluntary \$25 per term for Zoom classes. Please remember to pay your **Membership Fees (\$40) for 2022**. Our only income is from Membership and Class fees. You have been very generous in the past and I hope you will continue to be so in the future.

Current classes - Reminder

Currently we must all wear masks when attending U3A venues but may remove them when in class and sitting down. Remember to wear your mask correctly. It must cover your nose and mouth.

Remember to log in with the Government QR Code before you enter the U3A rooms. After you have entered you should use either the camera on your phone or a QR App to record your attendance in the class. Tutors also need to do this. The QR sheets for class attendance at City Campus are in the Foyer and also in the class rooms.

2022 is a new beginning. Hopefully there will be less disruption to our timetable. Keep a lookout for new classes on offer as some old favourites return and some new Tutors come on board.

Coming Ready or Not! Electric Vehicles are Here to Stay





The session will be introduced by Dianne Tucker, Australian Conservation Foundation, Brisbane South & Logan Community Group.

Electric vehicles, from scooters to trucks and buses, are here now, and both the uptake and model availability is increasing rapidly.

So, what is this new technology, and what are these vehicles like to own? Why are electric vehicles starting to supplant more conventional vehicles and what may be the flow-ons for broader society?

Les and John have been keen early adopters of electric vehicles. Les has 9 years of owning an EV, and currently works in the burgeoning electric vehicle charging industry. John has been driving electric cars for the past 7 years. Les and John are keen to create greater understanding about the technology and its benefits beyond just transportation.

This fascinating session will include: currently available electric cars; comparative costs; charging; the coming use of battery power for home and vehicles; and much more.

If you have taken a test and don't know what to do now you may be interested.

Is a DNA test safe, how do you take a DNA test and how does it work?

How can it help with your family history? And what do I do now – I have 1000's of cousins!!

Join us on 25 Nov 2021 to get some of the answers to these questions and more.

Living in the ACT, Marilyn began her family history journey in 2010 and took her first DNA test in 2015. Since then, she has also taken a mitochondrial DNA test and manages a number of other relatives' DNA results.

In 2017 Marilyn attended a meeting to discuss the formation of a Special Interest Group (SIG) on DNA for the ACT Family History Group and since then has been one of its co- coordinators. The aim of the DNA SIG is to help members understand and interpret DNA results via education, support, and shared discussion. Marilyn is a former educator and also worked in the international student industry for many years. She now spends most of her time on the "ultimate puzzle" of her own genealogy and helping others with theirs.

We are sorry that Pamela's health is not allowing her to continue her Archaeology and Ancient History classes at U3A, where she has taught since 2005. All her former students are very grateful for her sessions and the detailed subject knowledge that she shared in her very enjoyable classes.

We studied Ancient Egypt, the Persians, the Greeks, the Romans and archaeology. Whatever our reason for enrolling, Pamela stimulated us all, keeping us engaged and amused. We know that Caligula was 'a very unpleasant character' and some other emperors were 'nasty pieces of work'! She showed great interest in all of us, and remembered our names and asked about our lives outside class. Classes were very friendly, reflecting Pamela's love of people. We renewed old friendships and made new ones and we all felt relaxed enough to make comments and discuss points that she made.

We were all impressed by Pamela's knowledge of her subject and the preparation she did for each lesson. We thoroughly enjoyed the slides and the stories of her travels. We felt we were lucky to attend classes with an archaeologist who had experience in the field, anecdotes to share and a network of experts to be consulted or invited to class as guest speakers. She has been an inspiring tutor, and has opened our eyes to many aspects of Ancient History and Archaeology. We now watch SBS archaeology programs with a better understanding, thanks to Pamela!

Pamela shared aspects of her life and her teaching career with us. She told us stories of her animals: Bacchus and Ariadne the goats, the sheep shorn by the New Zealand shearer, and Oliver the pig, everyone's favourite. Oliver started life as a little pig, and was supposed to stay that way but he Grew and Grew, until he ended up a Very Big Pig Indeed! He has now gone to live with one of Pamela's former students on a property outside Brisbane, where she can visit him and make sure he's happy. Recently he had to have his toenails trimmed. This involved giving him 40 Valium, an injection and the vet sitting on him to keep him still! This gives you some idea of Oliver's size and the anecdotes Pamela used to tell us at the start of class each week. It's no wonder we all enjoyed our time with her.
